- Wendover Woods is a woodland area in the Chiltern Hills, Buckinghamshire

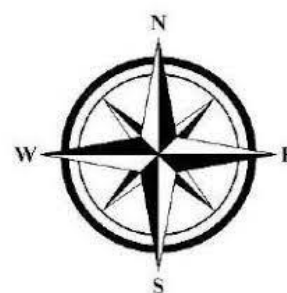
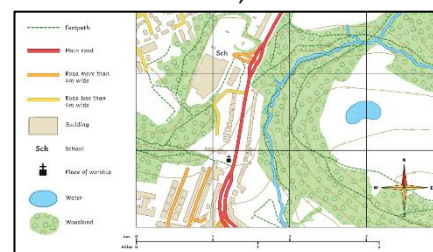
Wendover Woods

Wendover Woods is an area of woodland on the north edge of the Chiltern Hills in England. Named after the nearby town of Wendover, the woods are part of the Public Forest Estate and are managed by Forestry England. There are a mixture of coniferous and broad-leaved trees.



Maps and Compasses

A map is a smaller representation of the real world, so map symbols represent real objects and landmarks. Certain features like cities, roads and railways are very important and therefore, their map symbols are much larger than anything else.



The compass is a tool which points out directions, such as North, South, East and West. These are also known as the cardinal directions. It is a magnetised piece of metal that will turn towards the Earth's magnetic north pole.

Capital city		A capital city is where the county of region's government is located.
Map Key		A map key is a little box of information found at the bottom of a map. It contains an explanation of what the different lines and symbols on the map mean.
Symbols		A map is a smaller representation of the real world, so map symbols represent real objects and landmarks.
Compass		A compass is a tool which points out directions, such as North, South, East and West.
Weather patterns		A weather pattern occurs when the weather stays the same for days or weeks at a time. Some common weather patterns include hot and dry weather, wet and rainy weather, and cold weather.
Physical Features		Physical features are the natural things that you can see all around you, for example woodland, seas, mountains and rivers.
Human Features		Human features are things like houses, roads and bridges. They have been built by people.
Sea		A sea is a body of saltwater much smaller than an ocean, but technically all seas and oceans are joined together in one enormous world ocean.
Forest		A forest is an area mostly covered by trees that is home for lots of plants and animals.
