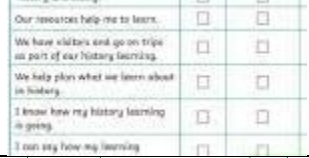
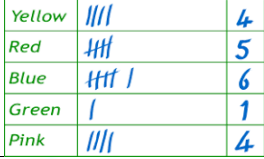


Forests across the world

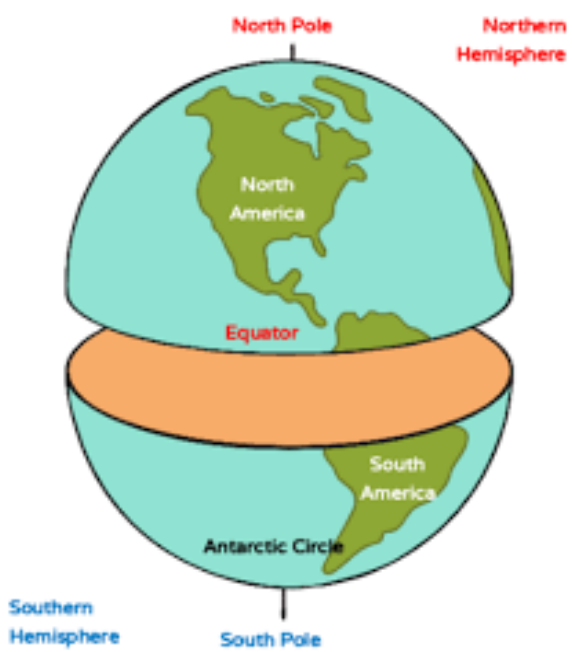
- The equator is the imaginary line that runs around the centre of the globe, between the North Pole and the South Pole
- Countries near the equator have a tropical climate – warm and wet.
- Countries closer to the North and South Poles are very cold because they get much less sunlight
- The South Pole is the point that is farthest south on the planet. It is in the Antarctica.
- The North Pole is the point that is farthest north on the planet. It is in the Arctic Ocean.
- Three types of forests are: Boreal, Temperate and Tropical
- Boreal Forests are found in regions with long, cold winter and short, moderately warm summers.
- Temperate Forest are found in regions with warmer summers and milder winters
- Tropical Forests are found in regions with high temperatures and high rainfall.

Community		A community is a word for a group of people who have things in common. They might live in the same area, go to the same school, do the same activities or have similar backgrounds.
Questionnaire		A questionnaire is a list of questions used to collect information from people so that conclusions can be drawn.
Survey		A survey is a data collection tool in which a list of questions is used to gather information about individuals or a group of people. It helps to collect data about people's opinions, behaviours.
Location		A location is the place where a particular point or object exists. Location is an important term in geography, and is usually considered more precise than place.
Boreal Forests		Boreal forests are found in northern parts of the world. These forests are cold. Spruce and pine trees grow in boreal forests
Temperate Forests		In regions of the world where it's not extremely hot or cold (called temperate regions), the forests are full of trees with wide, thin leaves.
Tropical Forests		Tropical rainforests are forests with tall trees, warm climates, and lots of rain.
Equator		The Equator is an imaginary line around the Earth that goes exactly midway between the North Pole and the South Pole and divides it into two equal halves, the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.
Temperature		Temperature is one of the basic elements of weather. Temperature is how warm or cold it is outside.

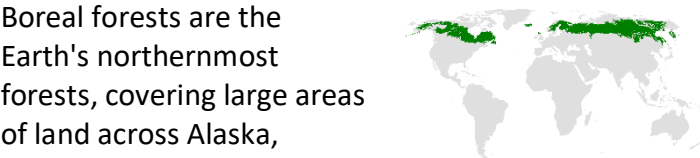

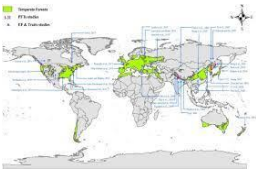

Boreal forests are the Earth's northernmost forests, covering large areas of land across Alaska, Canada, northern Europe, and Russia.



A temperate forest is a forest found between the tropical and boreal regions, located in the temperate zone. It is the second largest biome on our planet, covering 25% of the world's forest area.



Tropical Forests are located close to the equator. Tropical Forests get on average 12 hours of daily sunlight, with very little difference between months.
