Use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about material on the internet or other online technologies	Explain how other people's identity online can be different to their identity in real life. Describe ways in which people might make themselves look different online. Give examples of issues online that might make them feel sad, worried, uncomfortable or frightened - give examples of how they might get help	https://projectevolve.co.uk Mr PICT resources
Online Relationships		Use the internet to communicate with people they don't know well (e.g., email a pen pal in another school/country). Give examples of how they might use technology to communicate with others they don't know well.	
Online Reputations		Explain how information put online about them can last for a long time Know who to talk to if they think someone has made a mistake about putting something online	
Online Bullying		Give examples of bullying behaviour and how it could look online Understand how bullying can make someone feel. Talk about how someone can/would get help about being bullied online or offline.	
Managing Online Information		Use keywords in search engines. Demonstrate how to navigate a simple webpage to get to information they need (e.g. home, forward, back buttons; links, tabs and sections). Explain what voice activated searching is and how it might be used (e.g. Alexa, Google Now, Siri). Explain the difference between things that are imaginary, 'made up' or 'make believe' and things that are 'true' or 'real'. Explain why some information I find online may not be true	
Health, Well-being and Lifestyle		Explain simple guidance for using technology in different environments and settings Say how those rules/guides can help them	
Privacy and Security		Recognise more detailed examples of information that is personal to them (e.g. address, family's names, where they go to school). Explain why they should always ask a trusted adult before sharing information about themselves online. Explain how passwords can be used to protect information and devices.	
Copyright and Ownership		Describe why other people's work belongs to them Recognise that content on the internet may belong to other people.

Explain what is meant by the term 'identity'. Explain how they can represent themselves in different ways online. Online Relationships		Describe ways people who have similar likes and interests can get together online. Give examples of technology-specific forms of communication (e.g. emojis, acronyms, text speak). Explain some risks of communicating online with others they don't know very well Explain how their own and other people's feelings can be hurt by what is said or written online. Explain why they should be careful about who to trust online and what information they can trust people with Explain why they can take back their trust in someone or something if they feel nervous, uncomfortable or worried Explain what it means to 'know someone' online and why this might be different from knowing someone in real life Explain what is meant by 'trusting someone online' and why this is different from 'liking someone online'	
Online Reputations	Use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content.	Search for information about themselves online. Recognise they need to be careful before they share anything about themselves or others online. Know who to should ask if they are not sure about putting something online	
Online Bullying		Explain what bullying is and describe how people may bully others Describe rules about how to behave online and how to follow them.	
Managing Online Information	Use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.	Use key phrases in search engines. Explain what autocomplete is and how to choose the best suggestion Explain how the internet can be used to sell and buy things Explain the difference between a 'belief', an 'opinion' and a 'fact'	
Health, Well-being and Lifestyle		Explain why spending too much time using technology can sometimes have a negative impact on them Give some examples of activities where it is easy to spend a lot of time engaged (e.g. games, films, videos)	
Privacy and Security		Give reasons why they should only share information with people they choose to and can trust Explain that if they're not sure or feel pressured, they should ask a trusted adult Understand and can give reasons why passwords are important. Describe simple strategies for creating and keeping passwords private. Describe how connected devices can collect and share their information with others.	
Copyright and Ownership		Explain why copying someone else's work from the internet without permission can cause problems Give examples of what those problems might be

Online Relationships		Describe strategies for safe and fun experiences in a range of online social environments Give examples of how to be respectful to others online.	
Online Reputations		Describe how others can find out information about them by looking online Explain ways that some of the information about them online could have been created, copied or shared by others.	
Online Bullying		Identify some online technologies where bullying might take place Describe ways people can be bullied through a range of media (e.g. image, video, text, chat). Explain why they need to think carefully about how content they post might affect others, their feelings and how it may affect how others feel about them (their reputation)	
Managing Online Information		Analyse information and differentiate between 'opinions', 'beliefs' and 'facts'. Understand what criteria have to be met before something is a 'fact' Describe how they can search for information within a wide group of technologies (e.g. social media, image sites, video sites) Describe some of the methods used to encourage people to buy things online (e.g. advertising offers; in-app purchases, pop-ups) and can recognise some of these when they appear online Explain that some people they 'meet online' (e.g. through social media) may be computer programmes pretending to be real people Explain why lots of people sharing the same opinions or beliefs online does not make those opinions or beliefs true	
Health, Well-being and Lifestyle		Explain how using technology can distract them from other things they might do or should be doing. Identify times or situations when they might need to limit the amount of time they use technology. Suggest strategies to help them limit this time.	
Privacy and Security		Explain what a strong password is Describe strategies for keeping personal information private, depending on context. Explain that others online can pretend to be them or other people, including their friends -suggest reasons why people might do this Explain how internet use can be monitored.	
Copyright and Ownership		When searching on the internet for content to use, explain why they need to consider who owns it and whether they have the right to reuse it. Give some simple examples.	

Year 5: Digital Literacy



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Self Image	National Curriculum Objectives: Understand computer networks including the internet; how they can provide multiple services, such as the world-wide web; and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration. Use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content. Explain how identity online can be copied, modified or altered. Demonstrate responsible choices about their online identity, depending on context
Online Relationships		Explain that there are some people they communicate with online who may want to cause harm to them or their friends Recognise that this is not their fault Make positive contributions and be part of online communities. Describe some of the communities in which they are involved and describe how they collaborate with others positively
Online Reputations		Search for information about an individual online and create a summary report of the information they find. Describe ways that information about people online can be used by others to make judgments about an individual
Online Bullying		Recognise when someone is upset, hurt or angry online Describe how to get help for someone that is being bullied online and assess when they need to do or say something or tell someone. Explain how to block abusive users. Explain how they would report online bullying on the apps and platforms that they use. Describe the helpline services who can support them and what they would say and do if they needed help (e.g. Childline)
Managing Online Information		Use different search technologies. Evaluate digital content and can explain how they make choices from search results Explain key concepts including: data, information, fact, opinion belief, true, false, valid, reliable and evidence. Understand the difference between online mis-information (inaccurate information distributed by accident) and dis-information (inaccurate information deliberately distributed and intended to mislead) Explain what is meant by 'being sceptical' and give examples of when and why it is important to be 'sceptical' Explain what is meant by a 'hoax' Explain why they need to think carefully before they forward anything online. Explain why some information found online may not be honest, accurate or legal. Explain why information that is on a large number of sites may still be inaccurate or untrue and assess how this might happen (e.g. by accident or on purpose)
Health, Well-being and Lifestyle		Describe ways technology can affect healthy sleep and can describe some of the issues Describe some strategies, tips or advice to promote healthy sleep with regards to technology
Privacy and Security		Create and use strong and secure passwords Explain how many free apps or services may read and share private information (e.g. friends, contacts, likes, images, videos, voice, messages, geolocation) with others Explain how and why some apps may request or take payment for additional content (e.g. in-app purchases) and explain why they should seek permission from a trusted adult before purchasing
Copyright and Ownership		Assess and justify when it is acceptable to use the work of others Give examples of content that is permitted to be reused.

Year 6: Digital Literacy



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Self Image	National Curriculum Objectives: Understand computer networks including the internet; how they can provide multiple services, such as the world-wide web; and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration. Use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content. Use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact. 	Describe ways in which media can shape ideas about gender. Identify messages about gender roles and make judgements based on them. Challenge and explain why it is important to reject inappropriate messages about gender online. Describe issues online that might make them or others feel sad, worried, uncomfortable or frightened Give examples of how they might get help, both on and offline. Explain why they should keep asking until they get the help they need
Online Relationships		Show they understand their responsibilities for the well-being of others in their online social group. Explain how impulsive and rash communications online may cause problems (e.g. flaming, content produced in live streaming) Demonstrate how they would support others (including those who are having difficulties) online. Demonstrate ways of reporting problems online for both themselves and their friends.
Online Reputations		Explain how they are developing an online reputation which will allow other people to form opinions about them Describe some simple ways that help build a positive online reputation
Online Bullying		Describe how to capture bullying content as evidence (e.g screen-grab, • URL, profile) to share with others who can help Identify a range of ways to report concerns both in school and at home about online bullying.
Managing Online Information		Use search technologies effectively. Explain how search engines work and how results are selected and ranked. Demonstrate the strategies they would apply to be discerning in evaluating digital content Describe how some online information can be opinion and offer examples Explain how and why some people may present 'opinions' as 'facts' Define the terms 'influence', 'manipulation' and 'persuasion' and explain how they might encounter these online (e.g. advertising and 'ad targeting') Demonstrate strategies to enable them to analyse and evaluate the validity of 'facts' and explain why using these strategies are important Identify, flag and report inappropriate content
Health, Well-being and Lifestyle		Describe common systems that regulate age-related content (e.g. PEGI, BBFC, parental warnings) and describe their purpose Assess and action different strategies to limit the impact of technology on their health (e.g. nightshift mode, regular breaks, correct posture, sleep, diet and exercise) Explain the importance of self-regulating their use of technology and demonstrate the strategies used to do this (e.g. monitoring my time online, avoiding accidents)
Privacy and Security		Use different passwords for a range of online services Describe effective strategies for managing those passwords (e.g. password managers, acronyms, stories) Know what to do if their password is lost or stolen. Explain what app permissions are and can give some examples from the technology or services they use Describe simple ways to increase privacy on apps and services that provide privacy setting Describe ways in which some online content targets people to gain money / information illegally; describe ways to identify such content (e.g. scams, phishing)
Copyright and Ownership		Demonstrate the use of search tools to find and access online content which can be reused by others Demonstrate how to make references to and acknowledge sources they have used from the internet
