SUBSTITUTION

Technology acts as a direct substitute, with no functional change

AUGMENTATION

Technology acts as a direct substitute, with functional improvement

M

MODIFICATION

Technology allows for significant task redesign

R

REDEFINITION

Technology allows for the creation of new tasks, previously inconceivable

Presentation	PowerPoint/ Keynote	Show Me/ Explain Everything to demonstrate understanding	Combine audio, visual, text, notes (app smash) to create iMovie	Nearpod presentation - collaborative interaction with audience
Research	Use a search engine to collate information (copy and paste)	Share websites with other using share buttons/ airdrop	Download and annotate image (Skitch)	Mind-map concepts visually (ThingLink)
Writing Process	Copy type into a Word document	Use dictate features for efficiency	Post on Blog to engage with critical audience worldwide	Use iMovie Trailer to plan. Create interactive document (iBook creator)
